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1. Instead, the impact of media exposure **was** shaped by viewers' strength of ethnic identity.
2. There **was** no main effect of exposure.
3. Debates concerning corporate social and environmental responsibilities at the intergovernmental level **have** a long and complex history within the United Nations.
4. Attitudes towards native and non-native English speaking teachers **have** typically **been** investigated through questionnaire surveys, but, since such attitudes may involve prejudices, other research methods designed to elicit implicit attitudes may be preferable.
5. The non-AWL word forms **are** specialized terms in applied linguistics, terms related to language education and research methodology, and adjective/nouns indicating countries/languages. Pedagogical implications **are** made for both teachers and learners of academic English as a foreign language.
6. Without a firm footing in the written culture, it is not surprising that modern Thai society **have been** swamped by the new media.
7. The results **suggest** that employees' sense of psychological safety **is** significantly associated with feelings of vitality (both collected at time 1), which in turn **results** in involvement in creative work (collected time 2).
8. The VAT **has** taken the tax world by storm over the last fifty years, but left little trace in the academic literature.
9. The implications of an interpretative turn in social theorizing **are** explored,
10. The moderating effects of gender and the 11 coping responses **were** also examined.
