10111 English for Communication

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To be able to use English as a means for communication.
2. To study structures, vocabulary and important English idioms.
3. To equip students with skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing in English for accuracy and appropriateness in various situations

Course Description

Structure, vocabulary and English idioms used in listening, speaking, reading and writing English for communication.

10121 Human Civilization

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To have knowledge on Eastern and Western civilization in terms of politics, economy, and society.
2. To understand human civilization in the past which is fundamental of the current civilization.
3. To realize and appreciate the values of human civilization.

Course Description

Knowledge on Eastern and Western civilization human has created in terms of politics, economy, society, wisdom, arts, as well as science and technology.

10131 Human Society

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To understand the existence of human community and society.
2. To understand the political, legal, economic and social mechanisms affecting the organization of human society.
3. To promote the responsibility to the society and the nation.

Course Description

Basic characteristics of being human; cohesion into communities and societies; human distribution and settlements; the components of society; human behavior in society; political, legal, economic and social mechanisms affecting the organization of human society; social problems and methods to solve them; promotion of a good society.

10141 Science, Technology and Environment for Life

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To gain knowledge about the concepts, rules and development of science and technology, and how they influence of thought and human livelihood.
2. To gain knowledge of ecology concerning human beings.
3. To understand the relationship between humans, the environment, and the effects of science and technology on the environment.
4. To gain knowledge of the applications of science and technology in daily life.
5. To enhance scientific thinking and awareness of the need for environmental preservation.

Course Description

Concepts, theories, critical thinking, rules and development of science and technology; natural history concerning human beings; the parts of the human body; humans and the environment; hygiene and nutrition; the application of science, technology, and mathematics in everyday life.

10151 Thai Studies**(6 credits)****Objectives**

1. To learn about Thailand's history, society, language and culture.
2. To be able to apply the course knowledge to daily life.
3. To understand and take pride in what it means to be Thai.

Course Description

Knowledge about Thai in terms of history, settlement, politics, economy, culture, religion and ritual, language and literature, arts and culture.

10161 Thai for Communication**(6 credits)****Objectives**

1. To be able to use Thai language as a tool for communication.
2. To develop the language skills for communicating in various situations.
3. To promote the value needed for the use of Thai language.

Course Description

Significance of language, idea and communication; the art of using word, sentence, idiom, phrase ; development of listening, speaking, reading and writing skills to communicate effectively and creatively; using Thai language in daily life to pursuit of knowledge and transfer knowledge.

10162 Chinese for Communication**(6 credits)****Objectives**

1. To gain knowledge about Standard Chinese phonology, Mandarin phonetic alphabet (Hanyu Pinyin), and be able to write and pronounce the alphabet correctly.
2. To gain knowledge about Chinese characters--as basic words or assembled ones--and sentence structure and grammar for general communication, including practice with writing Chinese characters.
3. To be able to use Chinese in everyday life.

Course Description

Standard Chinese phonology, Hanyu Pinyin transcription, basic words, and dialogues for everyday use, structural grammar, and learn and practice writing of 550 Chinese characters.

10163 Khmer for Communication**(6 credits)****Objectives**

1. To possess knowledge on the phonology, letters, grammatical structure and basic sentence structure of Khmer.
2. To be able to use basic Khmer for communication in daily life.
3. To possess knowledge on Khmer words used in the Thai language.

Course Description

Khmer phonology; the practice of writing the Khmer alphabet; Crieng and Mul alphabets, basic Khmer words used in daily life; grammatical structure and basic sentence structure; listening, speaking, reading and writing skills for communication at the basic level; and Khmer words used in the Thai language.

33207 Economic and Public Finance

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To acquire knowledge and understanding on concepts, theories, principles, and methods for economic and public finance.
2. To be able to apply concepts, theories, principles, and methods for economic to practice of public finance management.
3. To be able to apply concepts, theories, principles, and methods for public finance to practice of government sector management.

Course Description

Principles, concepts, theories and methods concerning microeconomics and macroeconomics; government roles on economy; finance and budget; public debt; policy and regulations concerning finance and budget; government income and expense management; types of budget and budgeting process; techniques for analyze and prepare budget; problems and obstacles for Thai financing and budget.

33421 Principle of Local Administration

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To acquire knowledge and understanding on concepts and principles of local administration and also realize significance of democracy employment in public administration.
2. To acquire knowledge and understanding on local administration, system structure and process of local administration.
3. To be able to apply administrative concepts and principles to rational analysis of Thai local administration problems in order that it creates social benefits.

Course Description

Concepts and principles of local administration; local administration systems, forms, structure and relationship with central government; local administration policy and plans; organization and operations in local administrative bodies; public participation; local administration in Thailand; role of local administration in national economic and social development; problems in local administration, solutions and trends.

33422 Urban and Rural Development Administration

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To acquire knowledge and understanding on significance, concepts and theories of urban and rural development.
2. To acquire knowledge and understanding on scope, methods, forms, principles and measures for national and international urban and rural development administration.
3. To acquire knowledge and understanding on factors that have impact on urban and rural development and urban and rural development administration trends and direction.
4. To acquire knowledge and understanding of case studies and samples on national and international urban and rural development administration.

Course Description

Significance, concepts and theories of urban and rural development; scope, methods, forms, principles and measures for national and international urban and rural development administration; factors that have impact on urban and rural development and urban; urban and rural development administration systems; rural development administration trends and direction; case studies and samples on national and international urban and rural development administration.

33447 Local Services Management

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To acquire knowledge and understanding about concepts and principles for local administration missions and local services management.
2. To acquire knowledge and understanding about process, procedures, techniques, and methods for local services management.
3. To be able to usefully and properly apply knowledge about local services management to practice.

Course Description

Concepts and principles for local administration missions and local services management; process, procedures, techniques, and methods for local services management for general missions and special missions such as people's quality of life improvement, public utilities and facilities, career promotion and development, urban planning, natural resources and environment management, local arts, culture, and wisdom reservation and maintenance; problems and solutions of local services management.

80101 Thai Social and Political History

(6 credits)

Objective

The objective of this course is to help students gain an understanding of economic, social and cultural changes in Thailand and their impact on Thai political processes.

Course Description

This course provides knowledge regarding evolution and changes within the realm of Thai economics, society and culture which have affected the Thai political system and processes in different time periods.

80102 Introduction to Political Science

(6 credits)

Objectives

1. To encourage students to understand and be able to explain meanings, concepts and the evolution of political science, as well as political theories and international politics.
2. To guide students to understand and to be capable of explaining political institutions and processes, including political behaviours and phenomena.

Course Description

In order to achieve the aforementioned objectives, this course provides basic knowledge covering the content and evolution of political science, specifically the most basic concepts and definitions, such as state, sovereignty, political institutions and processes, political systems, political behaviour and phenomena. The basic knowledge provided by this course also covers political theories, concepts of civil rights and obligation, the relationship between state and its citizens, and international politics. Finally, this course also offers knowledge covering concepts and development in the history of ideas and practices in Thai political science.

80111 Introduction to Thai Politics and Government**(6 credits)*****Objectives***

To acquire knowledge of the development and essence of political and institutions, processes as well as problem of Thai politics and the government.

Course Description

This the course covers the development and essence of Thai politics and government, including Thai political institution and processes, major problems of Thai politics and government from the past to the present.

80202 Thai Political Institutions and Processes**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to guide students to understand Thai political processes affected by the political activities of various groups of people.

Course Description

This course offer students instruction about Thai political institutions and processes influentially entangled by the involvement of leaders and others in both official and unofficial capacities.

80203 Problems of Thai Political Development**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to encourage students to understand problems of Thai political development, particularly in terms of institutional and procedural problems.

Course Description

This course provides knowledge regarding political behaviours as integral factors in political problems, viewed by institutional and procedural aspects in particular. This course also points out that these problems are affected by the performance of leaders and others whether they are in official or unofficial positions.

80204 Thai Political Economy**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at helping students to understand fundamental concepts about the relationship between economics and politics so that they can analyse political power constructed and expanded by political and economic groups.

Course Description

In order to achieve the above aim, this course provides fundamental concepts about the relationship between economics and politics. This course will therefore cover knowledge regarding the evolution of economic groups in Thailand, general characteristics and mechanisms of expansion and relations among different economic groups, economic power constructed by political groups and vice versa.

80205 Socio-cultural Basis of Thai Politics**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The main objective of this course is to guide students to understand the relationship and impact of socio-cultural changes upon political systems, processes and behaviours that occurred after world War II.

Course Description

This course offers basic understanding about relationship between socio-cultural changes and their impacts on political systems, processes and behaviours, especially those that have occurred after World War II.

80206 Problems of Rural Development in Thailand**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to encourage students to gain awareness and understanding of the problems of rural development and approaches to solving rural problems.

Course Description

This course covers the economic, social, political and cultural environment of rural Thailand as well as the policies for solving rural problems in both public and private sectors.

80207 Political Problems in the Regions and Minority Groups in Thailand**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to gain awareness and understanding of problems regarding regional politics and Thai minority groups and approaches to solving these problems.

Course Description

In order to achieve the above objective, this course provides general knowledge covering physical, economic, political, and socio-cultural conditions at the regional level that affect Thai minority groups. This course also provides concepts and problem-solving policies regarding regional and ethnic minority group politics.

80212 Introduction to Public Administration and Policy**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to gain awareness and understanding of problems regarding regional politics and Thai minority groups and approaches to solving these problems.

Course Description

The course covers meanings and concepts of and approaches to the study of public administration and policy, essence, techniques and processes of public administration, good governance in organization, and also public administration in democratic processes and modern political society.

80308 Thailand and Foreign Relations**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to understand methods of setting international policy and their impact on Thai politics and government.

Course Description

This course covers the relationship between Thailand and foreign countries, including factors and procedures in formulating Thai foreign policies during various eras, as well as the effect of Thai politics on relations with foreign countries.

80309 Current Political Issues**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to follow and be able to analyze political conditions that have importance for Thailand.

Course Description

The course covers important issues in current Thai politics. Students are required to follow political situations and events which they consider important to Thailand.

80410 Professional Experience in Political Science**(6 credits)*****Objectives***

1. To draw on all knowledge in political science and related fields in order to assist analysis, explanation and forecasting political phenomena in a theoretically correct manner.
2. To have the ability to apply knowledge in political science and related fields efficiently in professions in both the public and private sectors.
3. To have knowledge and understanding of the significance of the political science profession and the roles of political scientists.
4. To have the ability to continually pursue self-development to be knowledgeable, capable, have the right character and social skills for society, leadership, morality and ethics.

Course Description

This course provides the application of all knowledge in political science using to analyze and explain political problems and phenomena both within Thai society and in foreign countries in a theoretically correct manner. Students will learn how to apply knowledge in political science and related fields efficiently in professions in both public and private sectors, evaluation of potential, environment and forecasts of future trends, as well as developing one's own social aptitude, skills, effective leadership, morality and ethics.

81310 Political Philosophy**(6 credits)*****Objectives***

1. To understand ideas in Eastern and Western political philosophy.
2. To explain and analyze the problems occurred in various present-day political systems.

Course Description

Students will explore western concepts from ancient times to the present, especially the political philosophy of Plato and Aristotle in the classical period, in Roman and medieval period such as Thomas Aquinas, Machiavelli, Hobbes, Rousseau, Montesquieu, Bentham, Hegel, Berg and Marx. The course, in addition, will provided the essence and debate on key concepts such as sovereignty, social contract, society, liberalism and socialism, and also the eastern political philosophy. These philosophical concepts will be applied to analyze and evaluate the present political problems in various political system.

81311 Principles and Methods of Political Science**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to have knowledge and be able to explain about the evolution, scope, status and approaches to studies in political science, as well as significant analysis regarding states, political institutions, and so on.

Course Description

This course covers the evolution, scope, status and study guidelines of political science in antiquity, after World War II, in the era of behavioral science and later, focusing on content, study approach and significant analysis about states, political institutions, powers, political groups, public policy and political systems. Also covered are political economics principles including the evolution, scope, status and study approach as well as the influence of the economic system on political changes, relations between political science and other social sciences; the evolution, scope and status of political science in Thailand.

81312 Principles and Methods of Public Administration**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to know and be able to explain the evolution, scope, status and study approach of public administration globally and in Thailand.

Course Description

In this course, students will learn about the evolution, scope, status and study approaches of public administration including the content of public policy, organizational behavior, and management science including systematic management, diagnosis and direction, policy analysis and theories about groups, roles, exchange and evaluation. Students also gain knowledge about the evolution, scope and status of public administration science in Thailand.

81314 An Introduction to Political Research**(6 credits)*****Objectives***

1. To have knowledge and understanding of scientific philosophy along with the ability to pursue further knowledge in political science.
2. To be able to apply both qualitative and quantitative research methodologies in political science to Thai political science research.
3. To be able to identify problems and obstacles in Thai political science research.

Course Description

The course covers the scientific philosophy and philosophy of political science, methods of pursuing knowledge, scope of political science research, theoretical frameworks in political science research, as well as qualitative and quantitative research in political science. It also covers the procedural steps of political science research, problems, obstacles and the direction of Thai political science research.

81415 Policy, Project and Project Management**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to understand and enhance knowledge and ability in learning and analytical study of the processes of policy assignment, project planning methodology and project management.

Course Description

Students will learn about fundamental principles, methods, processes, and analytical study approaches in policy assignment and project planning, including the behavior and dynamics of various related power sources along with qualitative and quantitative project analysis. They will also study principles, methods and problems in project management, including solicitation, acceptance, planning, forming organizational structure, the role and authority of project organizers as well as control and progress follow up, reporting, information system management, feedback and a sample case study from Thailand.

81416 Public Personnel Management**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to enhance knowledge and understanding about the process of public personnel management in units and differences between private and public personnel management.

Course Description

This course covers the history and evolution of careers in bureaucratic systems, personnel administration philosophy and procedures, agencies related to personnel administration and the influence of behavioral science on personnel administration by focusing on personnel evaluation, training and development of salary management. These topics will compare the characteristics of private personnel administration with public personnel administration by using a Thai case study as an example.

81417 Organization Management and Development**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to have knowledge about the principles and procedures of organization management, be aware of the impact of academic changes in the organization on organizational structure and be able to evaluate organizational development projects.

Course Description

This course explores the systematic conceptual study of principles about structures and processes in organization management and the impact of academic changes on the organization, as well as environmental changes, which affects the organization's structure, theory and approaches to organizational development. It also provides an analysis of the necessity for strategic development, organizational development approach, steps in the implementation process and evaluation of organizational development projects. These topics will be studied by using a Thai case study as a supplementary sample.

81427 Criminal Law for Political Science**(6 credits)*****Objective***

1. To give students foundational knowledge about law in general, principles and theory of criminal law and the criminal code, provisions of criminal law, and all types of violations of criminal law including petty offences.
2. To give students the ability to apply their knowledge to judge problems, facts and provisions of the law correctly.

Course Description

In this course, students will learn about characteristics of criminal law, criminal liability theory, jurisdiction, attempted offences, principals and accomplices in an offence, multiple offences, recidivism, statute of limitations prescription, punishments in criminal law and provisions on petty offences, criminal offences relating to national security, offences against public administration, and offences against life, body, property and so on.

81428 Criminal Procedure and Evidence for Political Science**(6 credits)*****Objective***

1. To give students knowledge and understanding about criminal proceedings and the criminal procedure code regarding administrative officers, police, inquiry officials, public prosecutors and courts.
2. To give students knowledge and understanding about evidence in criminal cases.
3. To give students the ability to apply their knowledge to judge any problems, facts or laws that may arise.

Course Description

This course explores the criminal procedure code starting with the basic principles and structure of the Criminal Procedure Code I and general principles. Students then learn about the powers of administrative officers, police, public prosecutors and courts as well as criminal case investigation, criminal measures and acting in accordance with criminal measures. The mentioned measures include the power of the public prosecutor to order cases, the filing of criminal and civil cases in connection with a criminal offence, criminal procedure in the court of first instance, criminal procedure in the Appeals Court and Supreme Court including the enforcement of judgments, pardon, commutation and reduction of punishment, court fees, evidence in criminal cases including oral evidence, documentary evidence and material evidence, and experts.

82201 Introduction to International Relations**(6 credits)*****Objective***

Offering knowledge regarding international politics included political-decision-making processes and factors affecting international relations in general is a foundation for this course. Causes of wars and conflicts are also studied as well as international practices and organizations with anticipation that solution could be found in order to at least lessen such conflicts. IR Theories are essential for this course.

Course Description

This introduction course covers international politics, various factors influencing international relations, e.g. national power and interests and balance of power. Policy-decision-making process and practices are affected by those factors. Causes of war and conflicts, roles of international laws and organizations are also studied, specifically after World War II period. Comprehending and having capability to apply IR theories are also accentuated.

82202 Comparative Politics**(6 credits)*****Objective***

To acquire knowledge about concepts, theories and methods of comparative study on forms, structured processes, and political development in various regions of the world.

Course Description

The course covers the concepts, theories and methods of comparative study on forms, structured, processes and political development in various regions of the world.

82227 Political and Social Thoughts**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course offers knowledge regarding political and social thoughts derived from the East and the West. They are foundation for explaining political and social phenomena in order to provide political and social alternatives.

Course Description

Not only is comprehending foundational essence of social and political thoughts originated from the East and the West thinkers necessary for explaining social and political phenomena. It could also generate ideas and actions to cope with domestic and international problems.

82321 Governments and Politics in Asia**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to have knowledge and understanding about the background, structure, duties, process and policy of the political systems of countries in Asia.

Course Description

This course covers background, duty, structure, process, policy and political systems of various countries in Southeast Asia, East Asia, West Asia, and South Asia, as well as economic and social environments affecting political systems in Asia. All of these studies will consider existing cultural and political behavior in various political systems of Asian countries.

82322 World Society**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to have knowledge about current world structures and the background of current systems as a foundation for understanding the formation and development of political and economic systems currently in use as well as political behavior of superpower countries which impacts world politics and currents of globalization.

Course Description

This course explores the current world structure and the background of existing systems, presented by explaining the formation, expansion and disintegration of important civilizations of ancient times, the Middle Ages and modern times, economic, social and technological change in different eras. The aforementioned knowledge will be a foundation for understanding the formation and development of current political and economic systems as well as superpower behavior in both the past and present. Said otherwise, this course provides knowledge about foreign policy, strategy, economic tactics, politics and military matters of superpower countries and their impact on world politics. In this course, students will also learn about the development of currents in globalization which impact global society and Thai society and impact individuals' ways of life in many ways.

82324 International Economics and Politics**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to have knowledge about concepts and theories related to international economics, features of international economic cooperation, and international linkages between economics and politics by considering the ways in which politics and economics affect each other in international economic organizations.

Course Description

In this course, students will learn about concepts and theories related to international economics, characteristics of cooperation, competition and conflict between nations in areas of commerce, finance, investment and assistance, and linkages between economic factors and international politics. These topics are addressed by considering interdependence, economic dependence and the formation of groups for regional economic integration around the world.

82325 International Conflicts and Cooperations**(6 credits)*****Objective***

The objective of this course is to have knowledge about international relations behavior in the form of the international conflict and cooperation, origination, development and impact of conflicts and international cooperation.

Course Description

The course covers the behavior of international relations in terms of conflicts and international cooperation, origination, characteristics and the causes of this behavior as well as conflicts and international cooperation in various dimensions and levels and the impact of conflicts and international cooperation. It is also covers approaches to resolving conflict and encouraging international cooperation at both bilateral and multilateral levels.

82326 International Law and International Organization**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to have knowledge and understanding about the origin of international law and international organizations and how the role and function of these institutions has affected past and present international political events.

Course Description

This course covers the origins of international law, its philosophy and concepts, the relationship between internal law and international law, international law used in times of peace and war. This course also provides knowledge about origination, development, structure and authority, role, success and failure of international organizations such as the League of Nations, United Nations, World Trade Organization and other regional organizations, and the role of international law in international relations.

82327 Introduction to ASEAN**(6 credits)*****Objective***

To offer knowledge on conceptual frameworks and rationales of regional cooperation and integration, and on the development and achievement of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations.

Course Description

A study of conceptual frameworks and rationales of regional cooperation and integration, and of the history of the establishment and achievement of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations.

82328 Public Policies in Global Contexts**(6 credits)*****Objective***

To knowledge in concepts, theories, and approaches in public policies in the presents era on varieties dimensions to impact in international affairs.

Course Description

Concepts, theories, and approaches in public policies in the presents era on various dimensions such as environment, economic, socio-culture, politics, and security that impact to the international affairs.

82423 International Politics in Asia**(6 credits)*****Objectives***

The objective of this course is to be able to explain and analyze various international political events involving countries in Asia whether it be cooperation, conflict or other types.

Course Description

Students will learn about the different types of events and relations of countries in Asia including those that have occurred in Southeast Asia, East Asia and South Asia, such as cooperation and conflict within various Asia regions and between countries in Asia and non-Asian countries which have strong interests in Asia, as well as the connection of these relations to Thailand.

82425 Political Doctrines and Development Strategies**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to increase their knowledge and understanding about the relationship between political ideology and strategy and be able to analyze the influence of political ideology on the setting of strategies for development.

Course Description

This course covers the relationship between political ideology and national development strategies, the influence of political ideology on determining development strategies and patterns of development, views of developing societies towards analyzing and solving problems, case studies comparing development experiences of countries with different political ideologies, as well as the development of concepts in various groups.

82426 Governments and Politics in Europe and America**(6 credits)*****Objective***

This course aims at guiding students to have knowledge and understanding of the background and political systems of various countries in Europe and America and be able to explain economic and social conditions which affect the political systems of those countries.

Course Description

In this course, students will learn about the background and political systems of various countries in Europe and America and their structure, function, processes and policy, as well as the impact of the economic and social environment on the political systems of Europe and America. All of these topics will involve consideration of the culture and political behavior existing in the political systems of various countries in Europe and America.

82427 Human Development in Global Contexts**(6 credits)*****Objective***

To enlighten approaches, theories and methodologies of human development and quality of life in global contexts for human security.

Course Description

Approaches, theories and methodologies of human development and quality of Life; physical and spiritual dimensions, in global in contexts for human security.

82428 ASEAN Community in International Affairs**(6 credits)*****Objective***

To offer knowledge on the establishment of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations including political, security, economic, social and cultural dimensions, as well as on relevant opportunities, problems, obstacles and challenging issues of ASEAN in various dimensions.

Course Description

A study of the establishment of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations on political, security, economic, social, cultural dimensions as well as opportunities, problem, obstacles and challenging issues of ASEAN in various aspects. Prerequisite: Introduction to ASEAN.

82429 Thailand s Foreign Affairs**(6 credits)*****Objective***

To understanding in foreign policy and impact on Thailand.

Course Description

Thailand and Foreign Relations. Factor and process in Thailand foreign policy formulation in each era and impact in Thai Societies.

83201 Local Politics and Government**(6 credits)*****Objective***

To acquire knowledge and understanding of the concepts, theories, and forms of local government in Thailand and foreign countries.

Course Description

The course covers the concepts of local politics and government, role of state, relation between local and national government, the development of Thai local politics, structural arrangement, modes of local government and trends of local politics and government in Thailand.

83202 Fundamental Laws for Political Science**(6 credits)*****Objective***

1. To acquire knowledge and understanding of Fundamental Laws
2. To acquire knowledge and understanding of legal criteria for political science practitioners.
3. To apply knowledge to decide legal problems for political science.

Course Description

The course covers meanings, several characteristics of laws, origins and development of laws, categories and principles of legal interpretation, law enforcement practices in the society, along with laws that are necessary for political scientists, such as civil and commercial law, labor law, Land law, social security law, intellectual property law, as well as legal mediation and conciliation.

1. To acquire knowledge and understanding of concepts and theories about democracy and democratization.
2. To acquire knowledge and understanding of factors and forms of transition to democracy and consolidation of democracy.
3. To acquire knowledge and understanding of experiences of democratization in various countries.

Course Description

This course covers the concepts and theories of democracy, factors leading to democratic transition, such as economic, political, and social change, processes and modes democratic transition and process of democratic consolidation, as well as experiences of the democratization process in foreign countries.

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
